Hey everyone!

I am very excited to introduce a new service project that I came across called Missing Maps. This collaborative project was created by organizations such as the Red Cross to map areas in the developing world that are vulnerable to crises and natural disasters. By mapping this regions, international and local NGOs are more prepared and able to respond to immediate crises in these areas.

In order to start volunteering with this organization, you can register to become a mapper through their website. There are plenty of tutorial videos to help get you started with the mapping procress and you can also learn to validate other maps. Volunteers use satellite imagery from OpenStreetMap to trace buildings, roadways, and other features. Once you are registered, you can start mapping these regions to help improve the lives of individuals living in developing nations.


